FOREWORD

e enter through doors every day. From bedroom to kitchen. From the house into morning light and into the car for our daily commute. PREFACE

o you feel change is on the horizon, in your not-too-distant future, or maybe even knocking at your door?

That's good news: You are standing at the doorway of a new season with greater possibilities than you've ever had before!

The reality is we all change, and change is necessary for growth and, in many cases, even survival. The challenges of change, the constancy of change, and the cost of change can be overwhelming, however. What we are settling into and embracing today is changing in our tomorrow, and the adjustment and challenges it demands of us at times seems more than we can handle and bear.

The cost—mentally, emotionally, and spiritually—of change seems more than we can afford. I find the most challenging times of change in my life, family, and ministry are in seasons of comfort and familiarity, when I don't want to change or even see or feel the need for change. The reality is, it's in those times that I probably need change the most. When things are comfortable and too familiar, my life is less fruitful and change is required.

God's plan is always progressive; it is always defining, aligning, preparing and even repairing us when needed for something greater that is in our future. His plan moves us from glory to

glory, season to season, to embrace the prophetic declaration the Father has spoken over our lives. The challenge is navigating, embracing, and stepping into those moments with faith and expectation—moments that unlock and lead to new seasons of abundance and fruitfulness.

The good news is the Father has given us a manual for embracing changing culture and times, a roadmap on how to navigate from one season to the next; it is called the Bible. From Genesis to Revelation—from the beginning to the end of the Bible—He gives us examples and stories of ordinary people who by faith walked through doorways that led to change and even supernatural testimonies of God's power and plan for their life.

In the Book of Exodus, God opens a door for His people that will lead them out of bondage and into a place of freedom and promise. He uses the Hebrew word bo, which means to "exit," but it also means to "enter"; and it has so much more depth and promise. Bo can also mean the following:

advance, apply, approach, arrive, associate, border, bring, bring to pass, come to pass, enter, enter and go, get, give, go, go through, harbor, harvest, indeed come, invade, keep on coming, present, proceed, reach, reenter, replace, return, set, spring, stand, sundown, sunset, sunrise, support, take, take place, visit, and so much more.

This small word, with such great weight and possibilities, is what the door that is opening in your life holds for you and your journey—endless possibilities.

We are going to look at the story of a family in the Old Testament who sensed God was doing something in their life in a difficult and fruitless season. We will unpack what was required of them and how they stepped into the threshold of a doorway. We will witness the powerful story of how an Ephesians 3:20 moment in their life unfolded—something more than they expected and beyond their comprehension.

In this verse, God says to His people, "When you come to the end of your thoughts and the end of your imagination, I start there." So if you are sensing God is doing something big in your life, something beyond your own abilities, then you are in the right place at the right time. You are getting ready to embrace the John 10:10 promise for your life, where the enemy of your destiny is silenced and the promise of purpose, provision, and prosperity is released. You are ready to walk through your *Door to More*.
